He patiently waited until they were done with him before he went his own way. He hated being alone (as well as taking baths) and always came to his mom or dad to sit on their lap and be gently petted. When mom was pregnant, he loved to sleep on her belly, with his front paws crossed. While dad still had plenty of hair on his head, Julio would come over and groom (i.e., lick) dad's hair. When kids grew up, he came to them as well. They adored him and spent hours with him every day after school. He brought to us so much happiness and joy over the years. During the COVID lockdown, our social kitty was probably the happiest but we could also see that he was slowing down, he quietly slept at mom's feet while she worked and only reminded us with a gentle meow to give him some treats once he was in the mood for someone new...and somehow we discovered that he had cravings for carbs – a Twinkie treat was his favorite. Dad's favorite past-time during the lockdown was to visit both Julio and mom every other hour too see how they were doing. Everything was going so well, it was almost spring time, Julio's favorite. We really thought he would come out of his shell again in the spring. In the past, he would go out in the back yard and lay down among the plants, nibbling on grass and enjoying sunshine. Alas, it was not to be this year, he really declined in the past few weeks, initially being very picky about what he ate and then he stopped eating. We took him to a vet and thought that he would bounce back like he always did, but new pills did not work. We are told that 19 years is quite a long life for a cat, but it's still very hard for everyone to deal with his passing since he was always there for us, gently tapping us on a leg when he wanted a yummy morsel or gently meowing like a kitten to let him in the back yard, every day for almost 20 years. He may have known that he was about to leave

his beloved family; in the last few days he followed us constantly and even at night he wanted to go to each of our beds to snuggle. We loved him to pieces and wish that we could have done something or have spent so much more time with him; he was always there for us and we just couldn't fathom that some day he won't. He died suddenly without meowing too much or making some kind of fuss which would alert us that something was very wrong. When we found him, we thought at first he was just sleeping, but we quickly realized that it was much, much worse.
